# How can we help members during these difficult times?



In the first instance if people are having difficulty with their fuel bills, they should contact their energy supplier. Local councils will also have some money available through the Household Support Fund. This fund is intended to act as a safety net for those who have fallen through the cracks and are struggling to pay for essentials such as energy and food. Each local council is allocated a certain amount from the overall fund, and it is down to them to decide who qualifies for help.

The agencies below all provide information on both fuel issues as well as general financial guidance and debt advice.
